



HSS Case Study: Lung Nodules—Case Overview

Member Information: A 65-70 year-old man presents with lung nodules newly discovered on screening lung imaging. Given that he is a former smoker and has significant asbestos exposure, his physician ordered a CT for a baseline.

Reason for Inter Consultation: "I was diagnosed with a lesion on my lungs and I want to use this service for a second opinion."

Original Diagnosis: Three small pulmonary nodules within the right lower lobe up to four millimeters in size, as well as aortic and coronary atherosclerosis.

Previous Treatments: None

Current Treatment Plan: He has been recommended a follow-up CT at twelve months and no further imaging if no change is detected.

Case Study: Lung Nodules—Best Doctors Impact

Expert Physician: <u>Dr. James P. Lamberti</u>, Assistant Clinical Professor of Medicine, Georgetown University School of Medicine Medical Director, Respiratory Care Services, Inova Fairfax Hospital

Impact: Treatment Clarification

The Best Doctors Expert confirmed the member's likely benign pulmonary nodules and clarified the follow-up imaging plan explaining that repeat imaging should be done **sooner** due to his history of smoking and asbestos exposure.

- **Expert Diagnosis:** The Expert confirmed the member's diagnosis of small pulmonary nodules. Lung nodules of this size usually represent old infection, granulomas, scar or intrapulmonary lymph node and are rarely malignant.
- **Expert Recommended Treatments:** The Expert clarified that the next imaging scan should be done in **six months** with a low dose CT scan. If there is no change then he can be followed yearly. He needs the imaging at a shorter interval because of his smoking history and asbestos exposure.

HSS Case Study: Fibroid—Case Overview

Member Information: 35-40 year-old woman who developed a change in her menses early last year consisting of heavy menstrual bleeding. She underwent evaluation and diagnostics and was diagnosed with a large 10cm fibroid tumor that was treated with surgical removal. Approximately three months following surgery she began to experience vaginal bleeding.

Reason for Inter Consultation: "My doctor is recommending another surgery and I would like to get another opinion."

Original Diagnosis: Fibroid

Previous Treatments: Surgery (myomectomy) was performed to remove the initial fibroid tumor.

Current Treatment Plan: Her gynecologist has recommended another surgery (hysteroscopic myomectomy) to remove the fibroid. Endometrial ablation and uterine artery embolization were also presented but discouraged due to child bearing implications. The member is also taking an iron supplement for anemia and is on birth control medication.

Case Study: Fibroid—Best Doctors Impact

Expert Physician: <u>Dr. Bradley S. Hurst</u>, Director of Assisted Reproduction, Carolinas Medical Center; Clinical Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology, University of North Carolina; Director, Assisted Reproduction, Carolinas Medical Center

Impact: Treatment Change

The Expert report provided the member with a conservative treatment option for management of her fibroids that is anticipated to **avert the need** for surgery.

- **Expert Diagnosis:** The vaginal bleeding is from uterine fibroids.
- **Expert Tests:** Saline infusion sonohysterography to assess location of the fibroids and also to verify if they could be removed using a vaginal scope rather than an abdominal incision.
- **Expert Recommended Treatment:** It is reasonable to try a levonorgestrel IUD, and if it is not effective, surgical options may be considered. If surgery is considered, hysteroscopic myomectomy, possibly combined with endometrial ablation, should be considered as the best option.
