EXISTING ISSUE & PRESENT STATE LAW	Under current law, proposed rate increases in the individual market and small group markets are reviewed by either the Department of Insurance or Department or Department of Managed Health Care to determine whether they are reasonable. Neither department has authority to regulate rates, even if they are found to be unreasonable. Pharmaceutical prices in the U.S. are increasing in a double digit trend. Pharmaceuticals are among the top two significant contributors to HSS health premium rate increases.
RECOMMENDED PROPOSAL	This bill requires drug manufacturers to report to state purchasers of health care services when drug prices are going to increase by more than 10% or when new drugs costing more than \$10,000 per course of treatment are going to be introduced to the market. It requires health plans and health insurers that report information on premium rates to their regulator to also include specified information relating to prescription drug spending. The bill would require drug manufacturers to report to state purchasers of health care services when drug prices are going to increase by more than 10% or when new drugs costing more than \$10,000 per course of treatment are going to be introduced to the market.
DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS OF RECOMMENDED PROPOSAL	Among the Legislative Committee's priorities are: Support Healthcare Cost and Quality Transparency and Support regulation of pharmaceutical pricing at state and federal level. This bill fulfills both of these priorities. It will increase awareness of pharmaceutical pricing and is hoped to influence legislative, regulatory action.
