


FLU VS. COVID

According to the CDC, flu and COVID-19 are both contagious respiratory illnesses, but they are caused by different viruses. COVID-19 is caused by SARS-CoV-2 and flu is caused by influenza viruses. Symptoms, length of infection, and recovery are similar for each virus and it is possible to contract both-which could be deadly or prolong symptoms and recovery.

There is no vaccine for COVID at this time. However, it's important to practice good hygiene, avoid close contact, stay home when you're sick, and get the flu vaccine to protect yourself from one of these viruses.

MYTH: THE FLU SHOT GIVES ME THE FLU

Flu vaccines cannot cause flu illness. because there is no active virus in the vaccine.

MYTH: FLU VACCINES WORKS RIGHT AWAY

It takes about two weeks after getting the vaccination for antibodies to develop and provide protection. Get the vaccine early for better protection.

MYTH: I'M SAFE, I GOT LAST YEAR'S SHOT

The vaccine lasts at least 6 months and decreases over time.
Additionally, the virus is constantly changing, so you'll need a flu vaccine each year for protection.

MYTH: FLU VACCINES PREVENT COVID

The flu shot won't protect you from COVID-19. Both viruses can be fatal and it's important to take precaution and to decrease the risk for at least one virus. Get the vaccine early to lower your odds.
