### **Commissioner Appointments**

SFHSS staff would like to welcome Gregg Sass as the newly elected Commissioner appointed by the City Controller. Commissioner Sass has served on the Health Service Board before and will complete the five-year term formally held by the late Randy Scott. Commissioner Mary Hao was also re-appointed by Mayor London Breed. Commissioner Hao will complete a five-year term ending.

#### **EQUITY & INCLUSION UPDATE**

SFHSS is leading with equity to support our membership in accessing the care they need when they need it, regardless of personal characteristics such as gender, ethnicity, geographic location, and socioeconomic status. As unique as we are individually, we cannot separate the importance of belonging from our physical and mental well-being. With this understanding, SFHSS is participating in the citywide Peer Learning Culture Cohort to reflect on practices departments have tried around creating affinity, belonging, and safety in the workplace. Our department will continue to uplift equity practices currently being implemented and the learnings we glean from other city partners doing this collaborative work.

A sense of belonging is also resonant across the City as the San Francisco Pride celebration approaches on June 29th and 30<sup>th</sup>. At the heart of <u>Pride</u> is the <u>unifying message</u> of freedom of expression and love for all. The <u>San Francisco Office of Transgender Initiatives</u> works to advance equity for transgender and gender nonconforming people in alignment with the City's <u>Gender Inclusion Policy</u>. We invite all staff and commissioners to learn <u>why pronouns matter</u> or to take a <u>Transgender 101 Course</u> to strengthen your commitment to inclusion and belonging.

On a national scale, <u>Juneteenth</u> is entering its fourth year as a federally recognized holiday, although it is the oldest nationally celebrated commemoration of the ending of slavery in the United States. June 19 marks explicitly the moment when those last enslaved in Galveston, Texas, received word of their freedom. The arduous history of these minority groups who have struggled for decades to overcome inequities is manifesting in social change. Please join me in appreciating the work of those engaged in efforts to create lasting equity, inclusion, and belonging for all.

#### SFHSS LEASE AGREEMENT

The lease for HSS office space at 1145 Market Street passed the Board of Supervisors Budget and Finance Committee on Wednesday, May 8, 2004. The item passed its first reading on Tuesday, May 29, 2024, and is scheduled for the second reading on Tuesday, June 4, and will now go before the Mayor for her signature. The 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of 1145 is being prepared for Well-Being and EAP to move from a temporary location on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor in late June/early July.

#### HEALTHCARE AFFORDABILITY BOARD AND ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Health Care Affordability Board is a decision-making body charged with setting statewide and sector-specific spending targets, appointing a Health Care Affordability Advisory Committee, and approving key benchmarks, such as alternative payment model adoption and the share of spending dedicated to primary care and behavioral health, among other responsibilities. 






















- -9% decrease in call volume compared to same month prior year 2023


## February 2024 Compared to February 2023: Calls, Cases, and % of Calls that Led to a Case




# Calls/Cases: Internal & External EAP

RE: Black-Out Period Notice, November 9, 2023 through June 2024

This memorandum shall serve as the Black-Out Period notification to the Health Service Board ("Board") that will begin today, November 9, 2023, and extend through both:

- the completion of the San Francisco Health Service System ("SFHSS") formal request for proposal for a Medicare Advantage PPO plan for the 2025 plan year ("2025 MA PPO RFP") and the presentation of the results of the 2025 MA PPO RFP to the Board, and
- the completion of the SFHSS Annual Rates and Benefits process for the 2025 plan year.

During this time, Board members are prohibited from unauthorized communications and other prohibited activities in connection with the 2025 MA PPO RFP and the SFHSS Annual Rates and Benefits process for the 2025 plan year.

Pursuant to the Board's Service Provider Selection Policy, the Board must be notified of the start of this Black-Out Period prior to the release of any solicitation for the selection of a primary service provider, as well as prior to the beginning of the annual SFHSS Rates and Benefits process. Such notice is given.

During this Black-Out Period, Board members are prohibited from any communications or activities, with current or potential future service providers, or their representatives, agents or officers, on matters relating to SFHSS competitive bid processes for the selection of the primary service provider for medical plans, including, but not limited to the 2025 MA PPO RFP (collectively, "Unauthorized RFP Communications and Other Prohibited Activities"), except for communications related to SFHSS matters occurring during public meetings of the Board, the Board of Supervisors, or committees thereof.

Unauthorized RFP Communications and Other Prohibited Activities include communications and activities prohibited by state and local laws related to conflicts of interest, including Section 15.103 of the City's Charter, Article III (Conduct of Government Officials and Employees), Chapter 2 (Conflict of Interest and Other Prohibited Activities) of City's Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code, Section 1.126 of the San Francisco Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code (Campaign Reform Ordinance), and Section 87100 et seq. and Section 1090 et seq. of the Government Code of the State of California.

Communications and activities include face-to-face conversations, conversations through one or more third parties or intermediaries, telephone conversations, emails, text messages, letters, faxes, or any other social media, written or electronic communications.

Any communications with current or potential future service providers for reasons unrelated to SFHSS during this period must be immediately disclosed in writing to the Executive Director and the Board.

I, John Arntz, as the Director of Elections for the City and County of San Francisco, hereby certify that, pursuant to Section 16.563(a) of the San Francisco Administrative Code, the Department of Elections has completed the counting of ballots for the 2024 San Francisco Health Service Board Election held from May 17, – May 31, 2024.

I further certify that as a result of such official count and tabulation of all votes recorded, of the three candidates, Jack Cremen received the highest number of votes with 8,049, and Arthur Howard received 6,355 votes which is the second highest number of votes and that both are elected to serve on the Health Service Board. Kelly McCray received 3,813 votes.
